

Brief biography of the author

Alessandro Beati was born in Laives (Bolzano) in 1962 and worked in telecommunications for forty years. In the early 1990s, he began studying sacred music and founded and directed the S. Maria Maddalena Choir in Vadena-Pfatten, the small town in the province of Bolzano where the novel is set, for thirteen years. From 2005, for the following fifteen years, he was the mayor of that same town. During this time, he founded and directed the Choir of the Mayors of Alto Adige-Südtirol – Bürgermeisterchor – Cor di ombolc, the only choral group of its kind in the entire peninsula. Today, he devotes himself primarily to his family and writing. This is his first book.
